In today's Gospel, Jesus clearly explains that anyone who follows him through the narrow gate of sacrificial service and sharing love will be saved. Jesus also admonishes his followers to concentrate on their own salvation by self-discipline rather than to worry about the salvation of others.

"How best does one enter into salvation and how urgent is it that one strive to enter now, before the Master closes the door?" Instead of asking how many will be saved, Jesus wants us to ask ourselves, "Am I prepared to be saved, choosing the narrow gate of sacrificial agape love and so loving others as Jesus loves them?"

Catholic teaching on salvation

Salvation is a past, present, and future event. We were saved from the bondage of sin when we were baptized as children or adults. We are being saved at present, when we cooperate with God's grace by loving others as Jesus did, by sharing our blessings with the needy, and by getting reconciled with God daily, asking His forgiveness for our sins. We will be eternally saved when we hear the loving invitation from Jesus, the Judge, at the moment of our death and on the day of the Last Judgment, saying: "Good and faithful servant, you were faithful in little things enter into the joy of vour Master."

Life messages

We need to cooperate with God's grace daily given to us: a) by choosing the narrow way and the narrow gate of self-control and self-discipline of our evil tendencies, evil habits, and addictions; b) by loving others, seeing the face of Jesus in them, and sharing our blessings with them sacrificially; c) by obtaining the daily Divine strength to practice self-control and sharing love through the guidance of the Holy Spirit in daily prayer, in Bible reading, and in reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist. *

Everyone longs for forgiveness. The great novelist Ernest Hemingway wrote a short story set in Spain titled, "The Capital of the World." The main character, Paco, has a falling out with his father and runs away from home. Desperate to find his son and bring him back, the father searches all of Madrid fruitlessly. Finally, he decides to place an ad in the local newspaper, which reads: "Dear Paco, meet me at the Hotel Montana at noon on Tuesday. All is forgiven. Papa."

In Spain, Paco is a common name. When Paco's father arrives at the hotel plaza on Tuesday, he cannot believe his eyes. A police squadron has been dispatched to control the crowd of eight hundred young men, all named Paco, all looking to reconcile with their fathers, all wanting forgiveness.

When we commit a sin or violate our conscience, we may dwell on our transgression. Sin hurts us before it hurts anyone else. We might ask: "Why did I do this? How could I commit such an evil act?" Sin paralyzes and breaks us. It breaks us from ourselves the person we are called to be—and we feel the shame and guilt. Paco had wanted to return home from the moment he had run away, but shame and guilt held him back. He waited until he received his father's message of acceptance and love. Jesus came into the world to say, "Your sins are forgiven; come back to the Father's love!" The Father's invitation is open-ended. Accept the prodigal and even scandalous love of the Father! See his short ad: "Dear son/daughter, meet me at the Church next Sunday. I long to see you. I love you. All is forgiven. Your loving Dad."
