The commitment would be attendance at 2 practices prior to the youth masses listed in the church bulletin, and of course attendance at the youth mass.



Many worry, about devaluation and shrinking purchasing power as they recall what money could buy when they were young. But in a sense what really devalues money is if we make bad use of it. "Use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends," said Jesus, "and when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity." The rich can be casual about money, but in tenements and shanty-towns around the world, even the price of a meal can be a precious and elusive thing. Oscar Wilde said that a cynic is "one who knows the price of everything and the value of nothing." A Christian should be the reverse: one who has less interest in the price of a thing than in its true value.

No Pockets in a Shroud

"The love of money is the root of all evil" says St Paul. He did not call *money itself* the root of all evil, but rather the *love of money*. Of course, money is needed as a means of exchanging goods in every organised society. But a person can become its slave through excessive love of money. It can become a substitute for God in one's life. In George Bernard Shaw's play, Major Barbara, when the rich industrialist was asked what was his religion he answered, "Why, I'm a millionaire. That's my religion!" but life is far more precious than the money we have, the food we eat or the clothes we wear. Possessions are only on loan to us, and in time we must leave them all behind. "Naked I came from my mother's womb," (Job 1:21), "and naked shall I return; the Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away."

The story about the Unjust Steward is about the fair and just use of money. Great personal wealth is rarely acquired without some sharp practice, and so Jesus regards money as somehow tainted. The laws and structures of society still seem to cater not so much to the common good but to the benefit of the wealthy and the privileged few. We need to keep in mind the words of Jesus, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, blessed are the merciful, blessed are those who strive for justice." This brings true fulfilment and the greatest reward of all, the friendship of God for all eternity. Deep down, we know that there are no pockets in a shroud.

Feast of St. Matthew

Patron Saint of Accountants, Bankers, Civil Servants, Tax Collectors

St. Matthew was one of the Twelve Apostles called by Our Lord. He is most known for his profession as a tax collector and his role as one of the four evangelists. The Church celebrates the feast of this great Saint out of reverence for his role as an Apostle of Christ, his Gospel writings, and his work of evangelization.

In his Gospel, St. Matthew focuses on proclaiming the message of the kingdom of God. He wrote his Gospel in Aramaic in hope that his account would convince his fellow Jewish brethren that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled in Him in a spiritual way.

At the beginning of Matthew 12, Matthew shows Jesus as leading Israel toward something greater than the laws and customs they were used to. The people at that time had known nothing other than their laws. Matthew shows Jesus as being the "Lord of the Sabbath" (Matthew 12:8), showing that He is above and beyond the laws they were used to, and He was leading them towards that.

In Matthew 21:5, Matthew depicts Jesus as the "King" who fulfills the prophecy from the Old Testament (Zechariah 9:9).

World Tourism Day

World Tourism Day 2025, themed "Tourism and Sustainable Transformation," calling for protecting the environment, tourists and workers, and offering Christian hope.

Tourism should be marked by justice and respect for Creation, and, for this Jubilee Year, those working in tourism should express Christian hope.

These elements were outlined in the Vatican's message for the 46th World Tourism Day 2025, which is observed annually on September 27, on the theme 'Tourism and Sustainable Transformation."

In the message, Archbishop Rino Fisichella, the Pro-Prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization, urged admiration for and protection of the Earth's resources, promotion of tourism through just practices, and adoption of sustainable lifestyles.

In light of global mobility, Archbishop Fisichella noted, "a use of resources is required that significantly impacts both people's health and the environment."

Therefore, he appealed to those working in tourism to seek solutions that respect environmental sustainability.

Justice, care and caution

Tourism, Archbishop Fisichella suggested, brings up the issue of justice, which, he stressed, means offering fair wages to those working in tourism.

"The inevitable increase in travelers must be matched by appropriate offerings," he said, while warning again speculation, thinking only about profits, and the attitude of some who, in the face of growing tourist activity, respond by closing their doors to visitors.

"Overcrowding, in some places," he recognized, "presents serious challenges," but, he reasoned, "these can be prevented through timely interventions and by making use of the tools that technology provides."

Christian community's participation in tourism

The Archbishop, recalled that the Christian community also participates in tourism, especially

through the hospitality they extend to pilgrims and tourists.

For this reason, he underscored, shrines are encouraged to remain "sacred spaces of authentic spirituality, where the heart finds comfort and reflection on life's fundamental questions is encouraged through silence, prayer, and dialogue with men and women of God."

Archbishop Fisichella, whose Dicastery is in charge of overseeing the 2025 Holy Year, reaffirmed his desire that "the Jubilee may inspire signs of hope by promoting sustainable use of resources."

Moreover, he announced that the Nineth World Congress on the Pastoral Care of Tourism will be held in Rome from 16-19 October, calling it "an important opportunity to reflect together on these themes and on the commitment the Church wishes to undertake so that tourism too may develop as a tool for evangelization and human advancement."
