

Grateful for what we have received

A friend was once rushed to hospital with a serious pain in his back, the result of an old football injury. He was successfully operated and made a rapid recovery. After his cure, he could hardly say enough in praise of his surgeon, the nurses and the whole hospital. Never again did he complain about our health services. It is normal to feel grateful to those who took good care of us. We have a new joy in living and thank God for being spared the other ailments we saw around us while in hospital. My friend even dropped his guard, to say a prayer of thanks. But the real test of gratitude comes later when the relief has worn off. Do we remember then what people did for us? Do we still say thanks to God, who saved our life?

Earlier generations used to say "Thank God" after remarking about fine weather, success in business or at school, the safe arrival of a child, or a recovery from illness. It's a good custom, built on a tradition of faith and prayer. We might wonder whether a people truly grateful to God would not show it more in their way of life. A grateful people might be more ready to share what they have. They would hardly be totally fixated on private property, while so many are unemployed and the politics of austerity threatens the welfare of the elderly and the chronically ill.



How satisfying it is to receive a sincere "Thank you" for a service truly appreciated. We might even be embarrassed by the warmth of another's thanks for something that didn't cost us much sacrifice; but there's still a warmth in being thanked for things we've done. The contrary also holds, of course: how hurtful it is to be consistently taken for granted, without ever a word of appreciation. One out of ten was a fairly poor proportion; but then, truly appreciative people, willing to make sacrifice to show their thanks, are rare enough. After Mass, we need to bring this thankful spirit into practical social expression in our treatment of others; seeing our life as gift, we should be better able to accept the realities of daily living and share our blessings with others in a generous spirit.

World Mission Sunday

Pope Leo XIV ministered for 22 years as a missionary in Peru. His vast experience clearly equips him to guide the universal church with a missionary heart. He is assisted by the Pontifical Mission Societies, which he describes as "the primary means for awakening missionary responsibility among all the baptized and supporting ecclesial communities and areas where the church is young."

As the church's missionary-in-chief he reminds us that mission is not a superfluous part of the church's life. Rather, it is her very nature, for we are a global family united by faith, baptism and a shared mission to evangelize all nations.

Each year on World Mission Sunday we celebrate as one church our universal call to mission. Established by Pope Pius XI in 1926, we set aside this day by offering special prayers and participating in a collection as a means of giving concrete expression of Catholic identity and to recommit ourselves in solidarity to the church's evangelizing mission.

As such, World Mission Sunday is a renewal of the church's missionary mandate, as given by Jesus as he commissioned his disciples: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19). This commission belongs to every baptized Catholic, and World Mission Sunday reminds us that the work of proclaiming the Gospel to all nations is our shared responsibility.

Please pray for the grace of healing for all those who are suffering from all types of Cancer, and illnesses and autoimmune diseases.



World Mission Sunday this year falls on the weekend of Oct. 18-19. The collection on this occasion is the only annual Catholic collection mandated by canon law for the universal church. It is a moment for every parish and every country to focus on the missionary nature of our faith to support the 1,124 mission territories that depend on the pope for a spiritual of material aid.

To be clear, funds collected serve as a vital lifeline for building churches, funding catechetical programs and social services, and supporting the formation of priests, religious sisters and lay catechists who are on the front lines of sharing the Gospel.

World Mission Sunday is our opportunity to support Pope Leo in his apostolic responsibilities. Last year alone, the Pontifical Mission Societies helped build nearly 1,000 churches, provided formation for 82,948 seminarians, supported more than 258,540 religious sisters and equipped 843,785 catechists. This could only be accomplished by the support of all the Catholics throughout the world.


